Topic	Heroes: There are heroes all around us – doing ordinary things in extraordinary ways.	
Literacy and Communication	<p>What is a 'hero'? Do you know any heroes? What is a difference between a superhero and a real-life hero? Use the Venn diagram worksheet to list all the characteristics of a superhero and a real-life hero. Remember that in the middle section where the circles overlap you should write all the things they have in common.</p> <p><u>How can one person make a big difference?</u> Look at Captains Tom Moore's remarkable achievement information sheet; Who is Captain Tom? Read through the information found in the resource, all about Captain Tom Moore's incredible achievement. Talk about how sometimes it's not the biggest actions that can have the biggest impact and how the things that we do affect the world around us! Captain Tom didn't even leave his garden but managed to raise a lot of money and raise the spirits of the nation! Can we think of anything we can do at the moment to help others?</p> <p><u>Writing Activity: Write a letter to Captain Tom to say a big 'THANK YOU' for helping everyone.</u></p> <p>Captain Tom Moore fundraising news story https://bbc.in/2Y0hMsC Tom Moore receiving a Pride of Britain Award https://bit.ly/3aAsW9X</p> <p>Search the daily newspaper or internet with your grownup and locate articles or pictures about heroic everyday deeds.</p> <p>Now write a letter, thank you card or make "You're Our Hero" card and send it to someone who has made a difference in your local community, this could be for a nurse, key worker or just a great family member or neighbour.</p>	
Maths and Problem Solving	<p>Visit MyMaths to complete activities on patterns and sequencing, position and turning.</p> <p>Play a game with a family member. Hide an object and give instructions to find it using directional language for example: go forward three steps, turn left/right, turn clockwise, anti-clockwise. Now swap. Can you follow directional language from someone else? Have fun!</p>	
Science and the outside environment	<p>What is a habitat?</p> <p>Watch this link https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ZrSWYE37MJs</p> <p>How many habitats can you think of?</p> <p>Sort animals into the correct habitats using worksheet provided. If you don't own a printer you can draw pictures of habitats and write or draw the animals that live there. Can you think of any other habitats and which animals live there?</p> <p>What habitats do we have in this country?</p>	
Humanities and Citizenship	<p>Last week you learnt about Florence Nightingale.
