
WHAT LEARNING HAS BEEN HAPPENING THIS HALF TERM?

At Broadbent Fold we continue to provide a rich and broad curriculum, which meets the needs of all our pupils and gets them prepared for their future. This term has been packed:

EYFS – Pupils have been reading Jack and the Beanstalk. They planted their own beans and have been taking good care of them. EYFS have been learning all about what plants need to grow. The seeds grew so huge!

Year 1 – The children have been learning all about where the North Pole, South Pole and equator are on a globe and comparing the key features of hot and cold places. They had a video call from a South Pole explorer and a trip to Eureka! What a lucky bunch of pupils.

Year 2 – Our pupils have been learning to survive in the



Year 3 – As well as their linking project, pupils have been going back in time to WW2. They visited Stockport Air Raid Shelter and have done some impressive writing.

Blindside – Year 5 and 6 watched a performance called 'Blindside'. This was a monologue highlighting the sensitive topic of violence against women and girls. Following the performance, we worked in groups to discuss the mature content of the themes explored. The children were respectful and sensible and all discussed how to spot signs of an unhealthy relationship and who they could turn to for help. We are very proud of our pupils and the mature attitude today.



Outdoors – Our school planter at the front of school was kindly donated to school by Stalybridge Women's Institute. Mrs Holt from the WI came to visit school to see how the flowers in the planter were developing. Mrs Holt was very happy that the Eco leaders have been looking after planter so well and have planted new bulbs and bedding plants. The Eco leaders also showed Mrs Holt our vegetable garden and the crocuses flowers that we had planted in the winter. Mrs Holt showed us a bird's nest that she had found in her garden. In gardening club we have weeded the

beds and planted some carrot and lettuce seeds. We were delighted to find that our apple trees and cherry trees are producing flowers. Fingers crossed we will get lots of fruit in the autumn!

Rugby – The Jason Robinson Trust have been in school delivering rugby lessons to our KS2 pupils. Charlie Felix Baffour has been in school teaching us his skills from Sale Sharks. Mini Marathon – Our pupils have been taking part in the TCS Mini Marathon where they had
